

Please don't forget...

To make a **Parent Governor Nomination** in time for the **1 May 2019** deadline.

The benefits of being a Parent Governor are that you will get to see things from the school's perspective and see how the school is managed. You'll gain an in-depth understanding and play an integral part in how decisions are made. It will allow you to develop many new skills (strategic planning, board experience, holding senior leaders to account, finance and oversight of budgets, human resources and performance management, project management, communication and teamwork, decision making, etc).

If you would like **more information on the role**, please make an appointment to meet with the Chair or another Governor, or pop in to speak to Annette (Clerk to the Governing Body) who would be glad to answer any questions you may have.

We hope the information below addresses any concerns that you may have or misconceptions about the role or the process:-



- Being a Governor usually requires about 8 hours per month (term time only) and attendance is required at meetings (3-4 evening meetings per year) and at committees (3-4 daytime meetings per year). Papers for meetings are sent out ahead of time for reading and preparation.
- Parent Governors are not delegates and do not speak 'on behalf' of the parent body. The role and responsibilities of parent governors are no different from those of the other Governors.
- If you feel you are not experienced enough because you haven't been on a board before, please do
 not worry. We have a very friendly and welcoming Governing Body made up of volunteers just like
 you! We provide free training for new Governors and encourage ongoing training to support all
 aspects of the role.
- "Someone else will do it" Parent Governor is an important role and we are in need of applicants... so please don't assume that there is a better candidate out there.
- We ask nominees to provide a statement explaining how they meet the expectations and criteria of the role, so that (if more than one nomination is received) it helps other parents make an informed decision when voting on who they would like to elect.
