#### LS3



This half term in Citizenship, LS3 have been learning about how to keep safe around medicines. The pupils produced a poster at the end and presented the information to their classmates. This is what they thought of the topic:



#### LS4



This half term in Maths, we have been learning all about

algebra. We have been learning how to draw a four quadrant axis using a ruler and graph paper. We can now label a pair of axis as X and Y. Furthermore, our students were challenged to plot positive and negative coordinates on a four quadrant axis. LS4 have thoroughly enjoyed learning about coordinates.



#### LS5

In Food Technology LS5 cooked Roasted Vegetable Curry. They learnt many skills, like peeling, chopping, baking and using the hob safely. They have also learnt



how to use and carry a sharp knife safely. They are amazing at washing

LS6 have been working on bar, block, pie and tally charts as well as pictograms. We have collected information by going to other classrooms and out to the staff car





park to find out the most popular colour of cars. We have learnt how to put the information correctly onto each different graph.

### LS7



In LS7 we have been studying Shakespeare's The Tempest in our English lessons. We have been reading the play as well as looking at the animated clips of the story. The students have been able to plot the story

during different stages, write character descriptions on Prospero one of the main characters and Caliban the character who is half human and half creature and hot seat as many of the other characters. They have also written diary entries and letters



as if they were one of the characters from the play.

In the photos the children are rehearsing one of the comedy scenes where Caliban, Trincolo and Stephano were plotting to kill Prospero. The students have really enjoyed studying this play.



#### LS8



In English this half term, LS8 have been studying a text from the Power of Reading scheme, called Arthur and the Golden Rope.

This is a fascinating tale about an unlikely hero who travels to the Norse World to complete several challenges in order to relight The Great Fire in his

small Icelandic village. The pupils have written newspaper reports on the events in the story, composed kenning and free verse poetry, and performed several scenes in a range of dramatic activities.

#### US1



US1 has been learning about Life Skills. They have each worked hard to develop their personal independence. The pupils have been successful in improving their skills in this subject. Some of the activities involved tasks carried out at home such as laying the table or using kitchen equipment safely. They have also learned about good teamwork and how to work and plan things together.

#### US3



The students in US3 have been working on a Music Unit in English this term. They have been taking part in an assortment

of activities, such as: identifying various genres of music through listening exercises, considering the meaning behind song lyrics, analysing a music magazine cover, writing a music review and retrieving information from a historical timeline.

In the pictures, the students can be seen delivering a PowerPoint presentation which they created to inform the class about a particular music genre:







Country, Reggae, Rock and Pop. The students taught their peers about their chosen genre; they shared what specific instruments and fashion style are common for the genre, they identified a popular musician, and they included a song for us to hear. Well done, US3!

### **Art in Lower Secondary**



During Spring 2 Lower Secondary have been studying and creating their own African masks.

Students learnt about the history of African masks and then designed their own mask. Each design had to include four key design criteria which are typical of African masks. These four key design criteria were the use of pattern, the use of symmetry, the use of earthy colours and the

enlargement of facial features.

The masks were created using a mixture of cardboard, tissue paper,

tin foil, cardboard shapes, PVA glue, acrylic paint, raffia string, wooden beads and glue.



The finished masks will be entered into the "Unique Art Awards 2019" funded by the Mouth and Foot Painting Trust Fund. Good luck to all entrants!















US4 have been busy this term completing their WJEC accreditation unit in printmaking.

Students were tasked to "choose an animal and create a series of relief prints based on the work of Andy Warhol".

Throughout the unit of learning students conducted research into pop art and Andy Warhol and responded to observations and experiences by creating pop art self-portraits by using online software. Students used a variety of materials, tools and techniques appropriate to printmaking including tracing images using a light box, lino cutting, rolling various coloured inks and indenting foam to make relief prints.

Pictured are the students presenting their printmaking outcomes in response to the task. The pictured prints are a result of a three step printing process.

Congratulations to these students on finishing their art accreditation. These brilliant prints will be proudly displayed around the school.









### **Food Technology**

In Food Technology we have been very busy making a variety of no sugar\low sugar cakes and biscuits. The pupils made no sugar brownies, vegan lemon cake, banana muffins and oat biscuits. We then sold them to pupils and staff at break time to raise money to support Red Nose Day. It was a very successful event and the pupils worked very hard to support it and a grand total of £45.00 was raised.





#### Music

LS1, LS2 & LS3 have been learning about Disco music. They have identified the features of the genre and then created their own disco track on GarageBand. This has included, programming the drum beat with midi, recording keyboard and bass parts and a string line.

LS4, LS5, LS6 and LS7 have been studying Gamelan music. They have been learning about the origins and culture surrounding the music and the main features. They have also played their own Gamelan style music, exploring the different aspects of the music.

LS8 have continued their work on serialism, a 20th Century compositional technique in which pieces of music are derived from a single 12-note tone row. Pupils have used their tone rows to derive chords and also inverted the tone and used the retrograde inversion too. They have used elements of chance to determine the other aspects of the composition, such as rolling a dice to determine note durations and repetitions.
