Giraffe Class

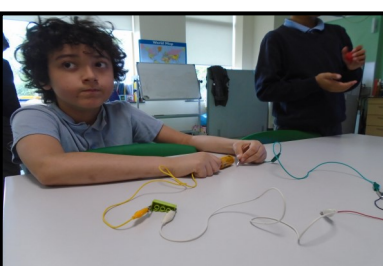
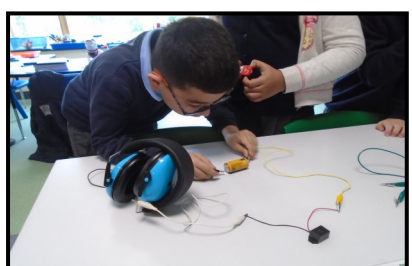
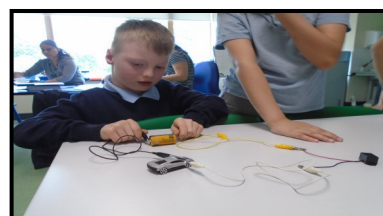
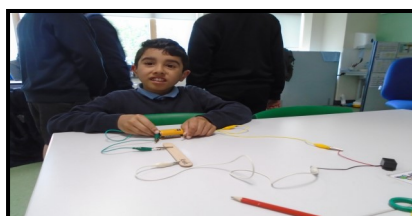
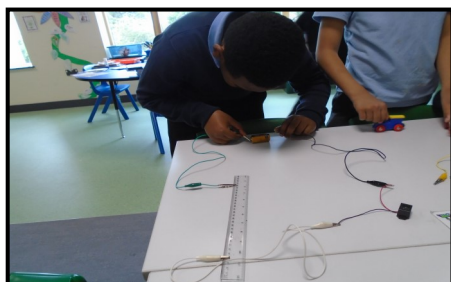

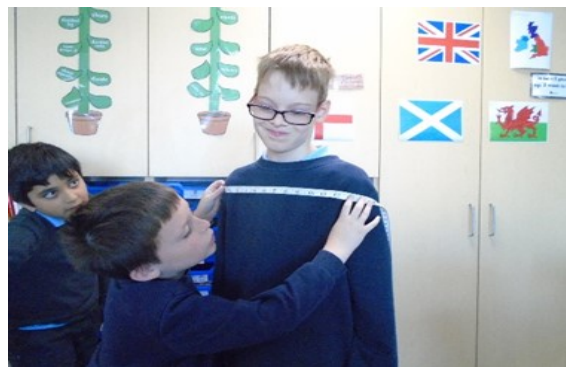
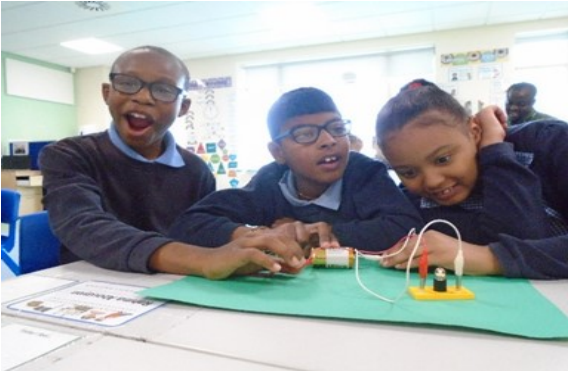


Zebra Class
